16. Who was Jesus' foster father?
Joseph CCC 437, 488, 1655; Mt 1:19, 20; Mt 2:13, 19-21
17. Is Jesus God, or is He man, or is He both God and man?
Jesus is both God and man; as the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, He is God; and since He took on a human nature from His mother Mary, He is man
