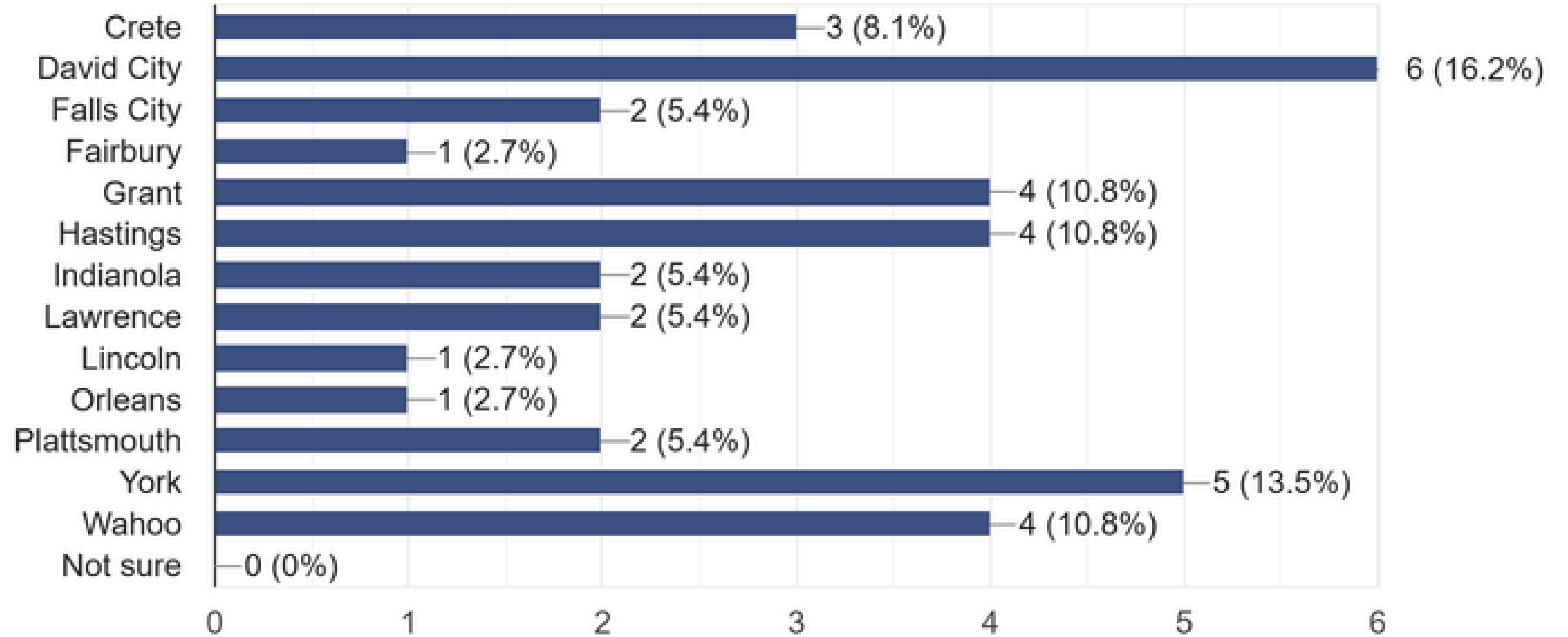

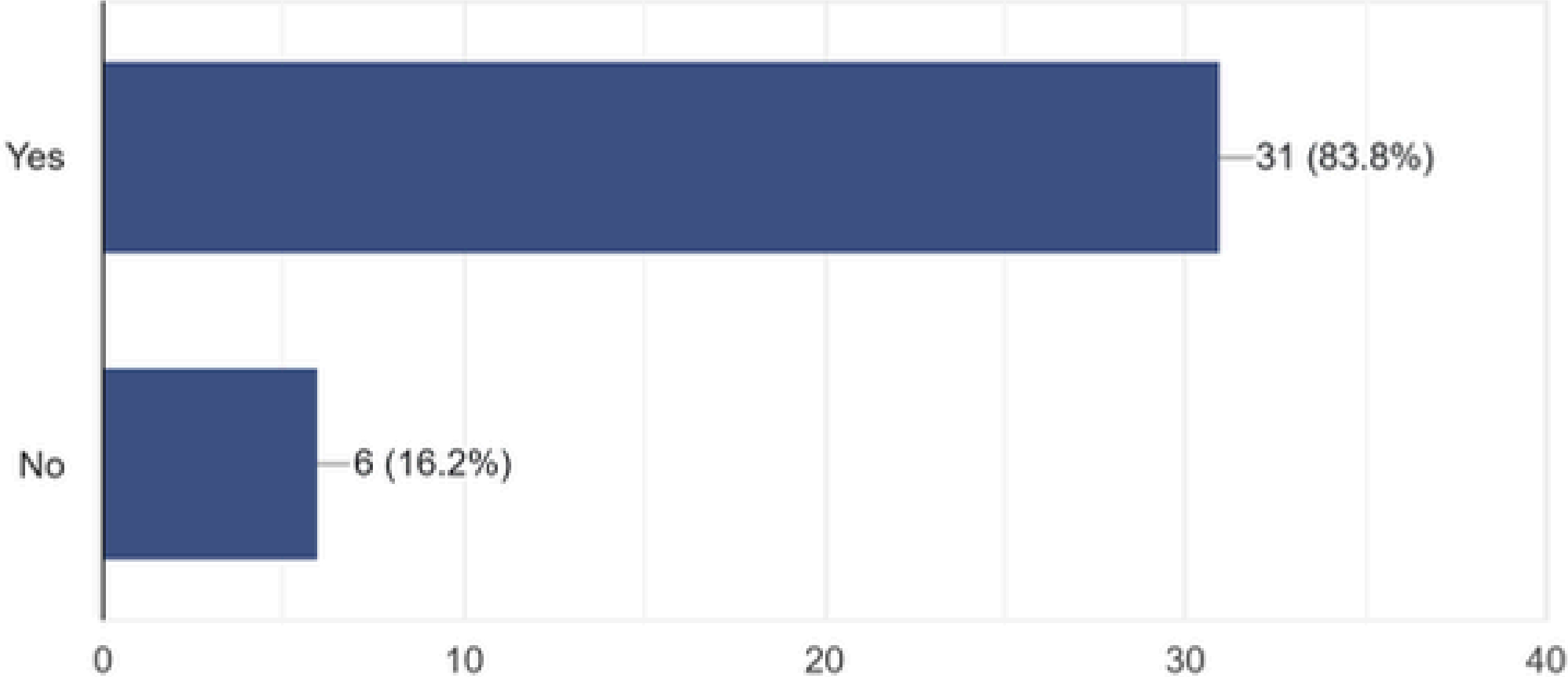
What is the name of your deanery?

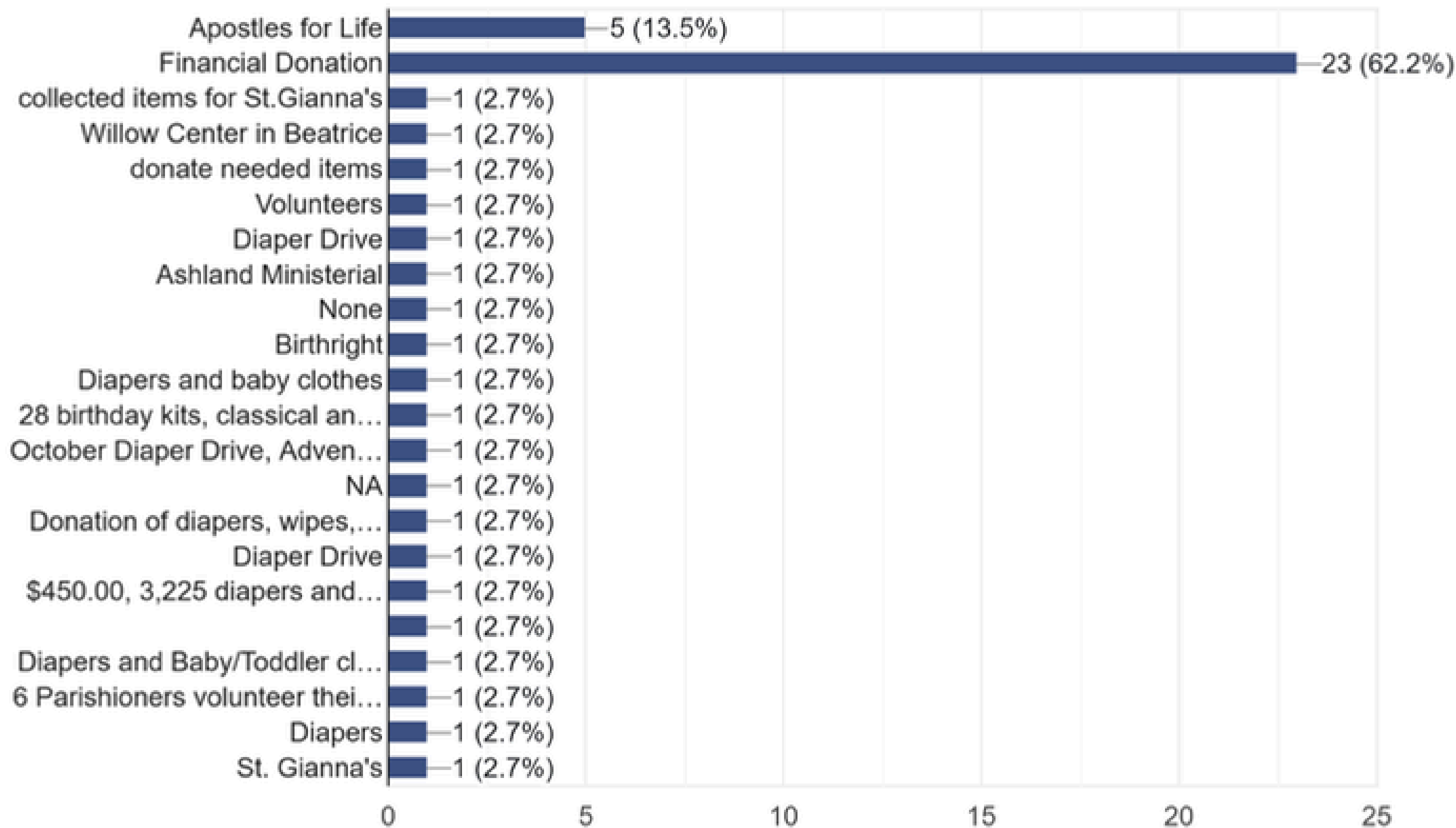


Did your parish contribute to the President's Project

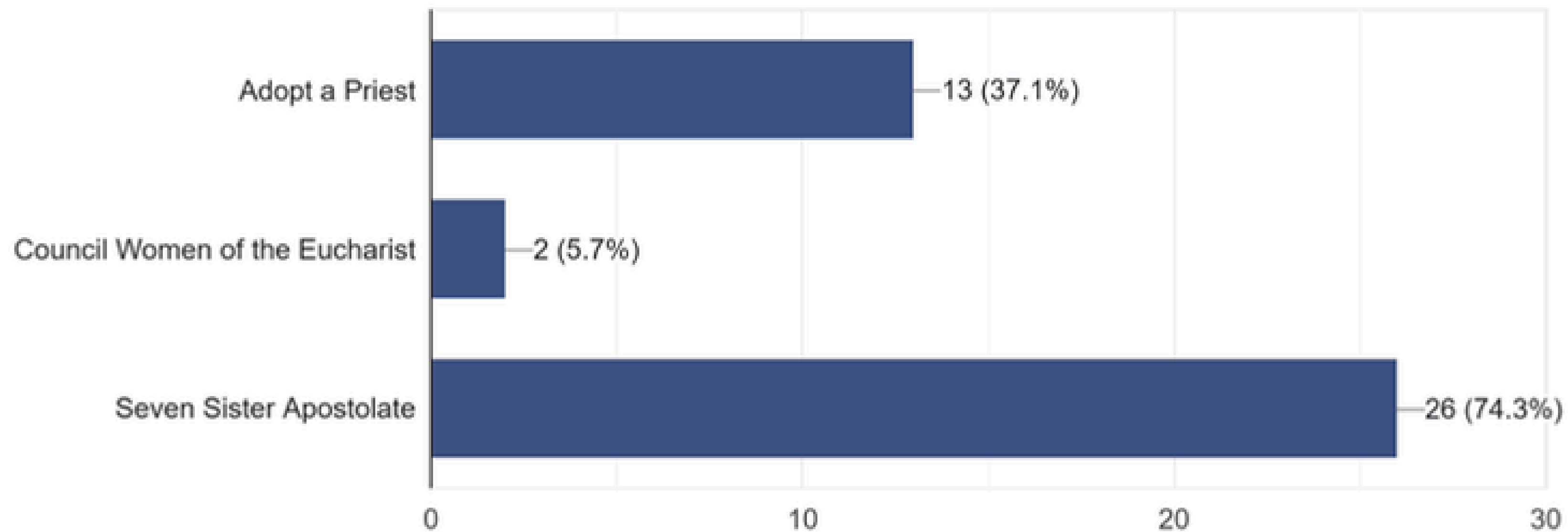

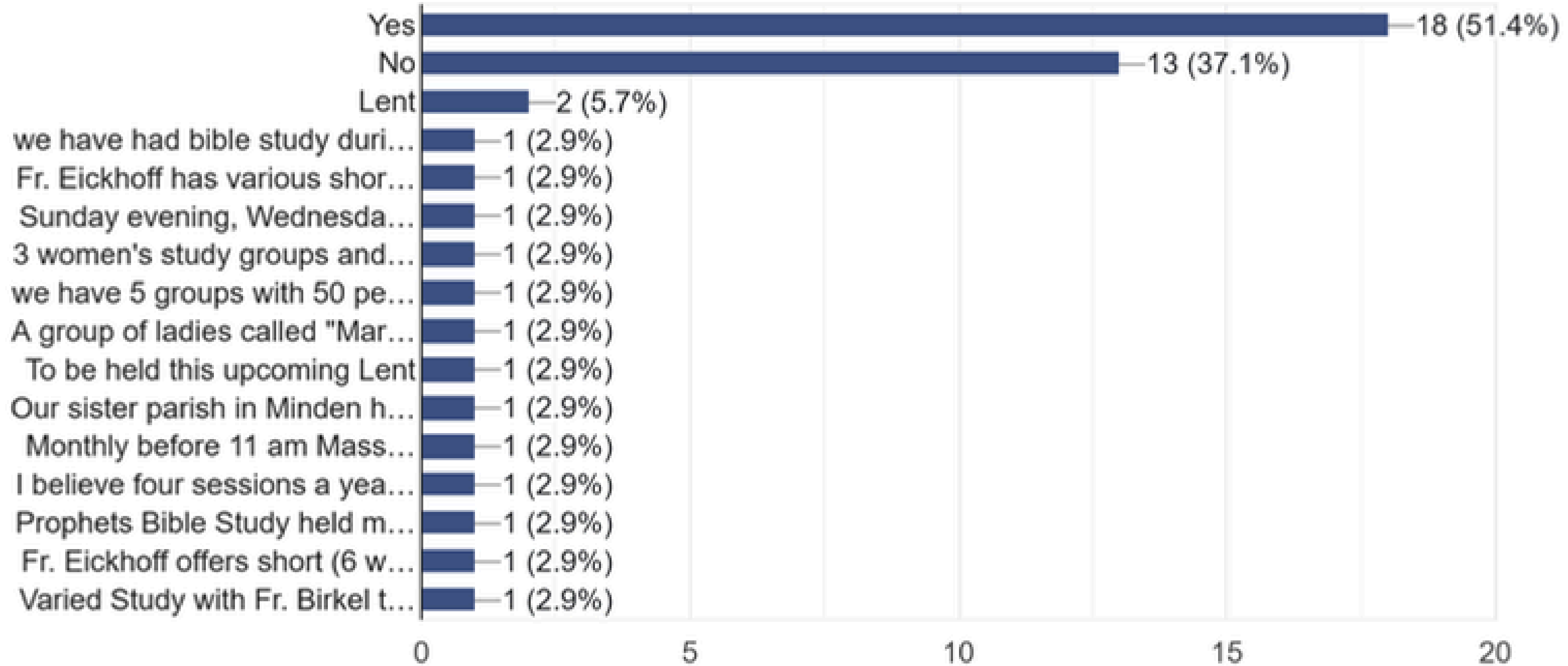

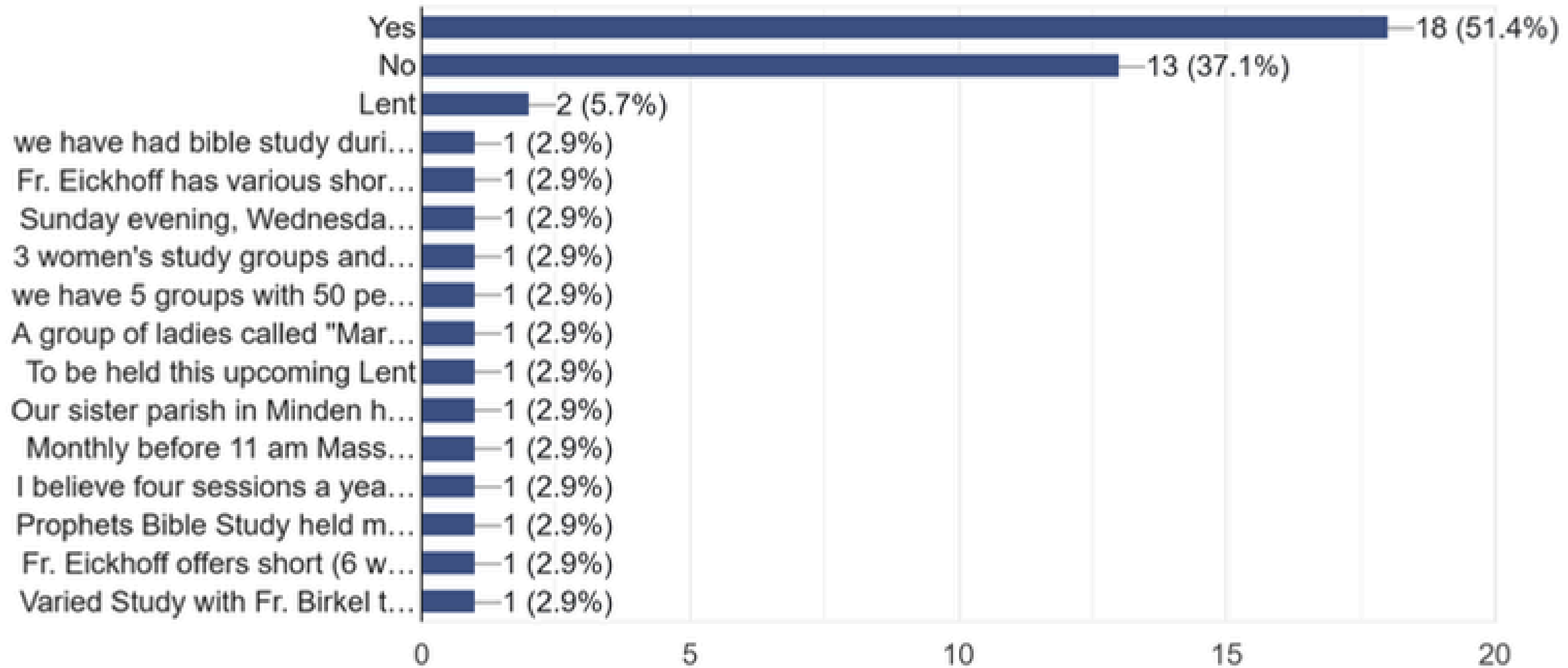
Does your parish hold a bible study and when?

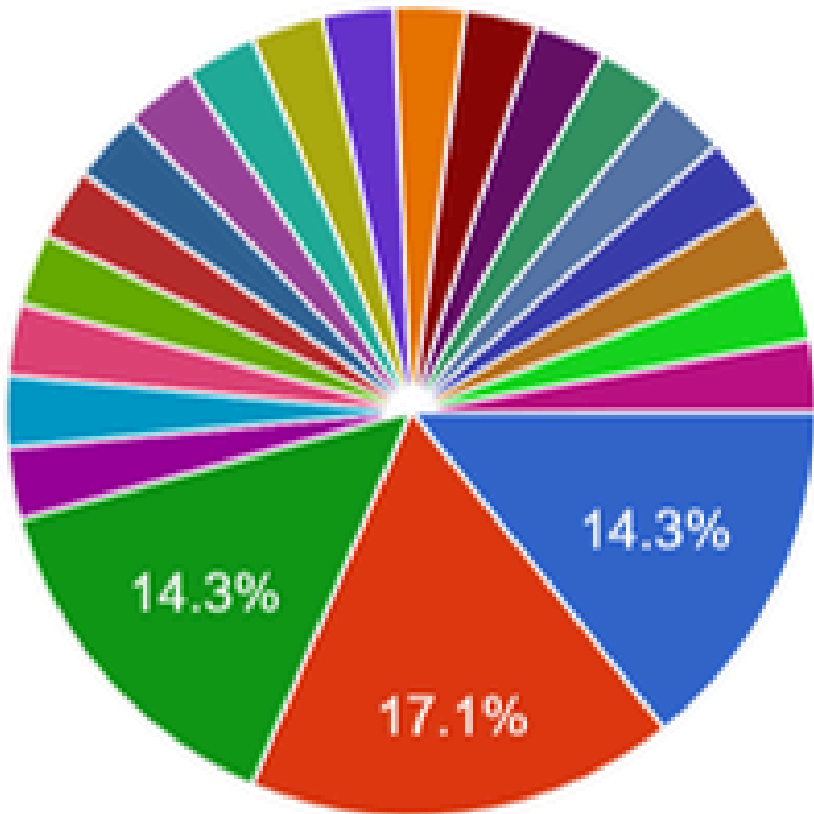

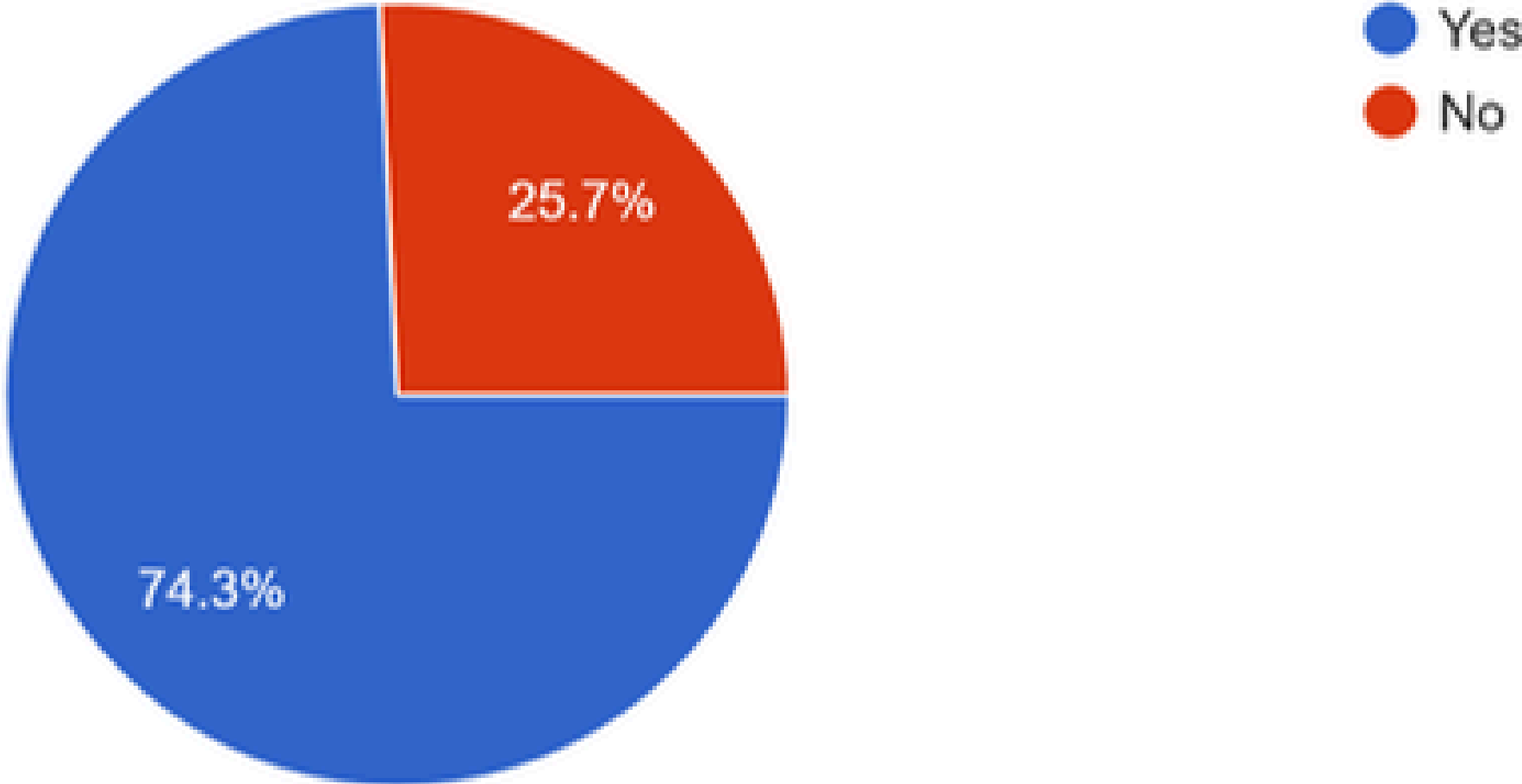

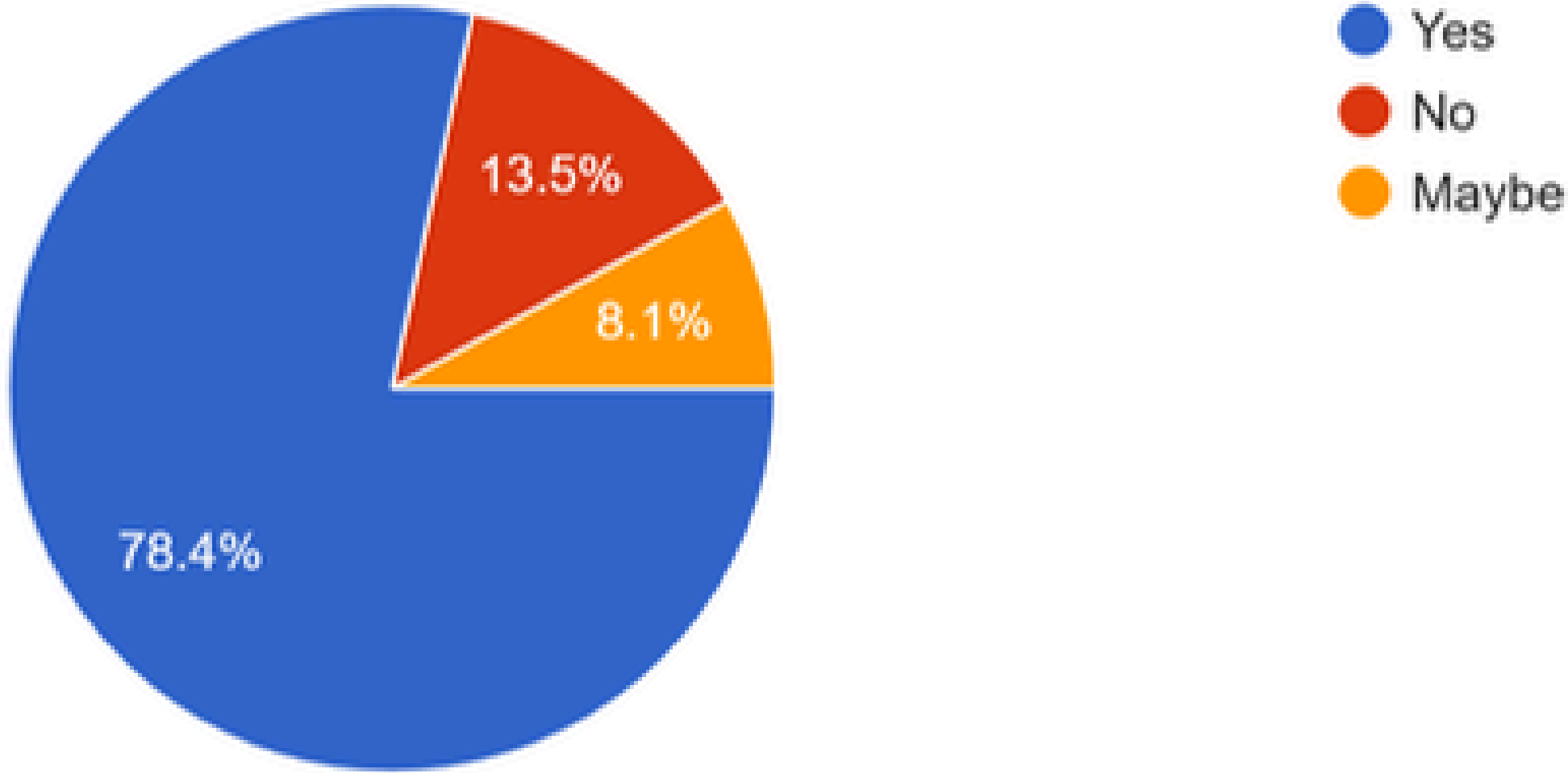

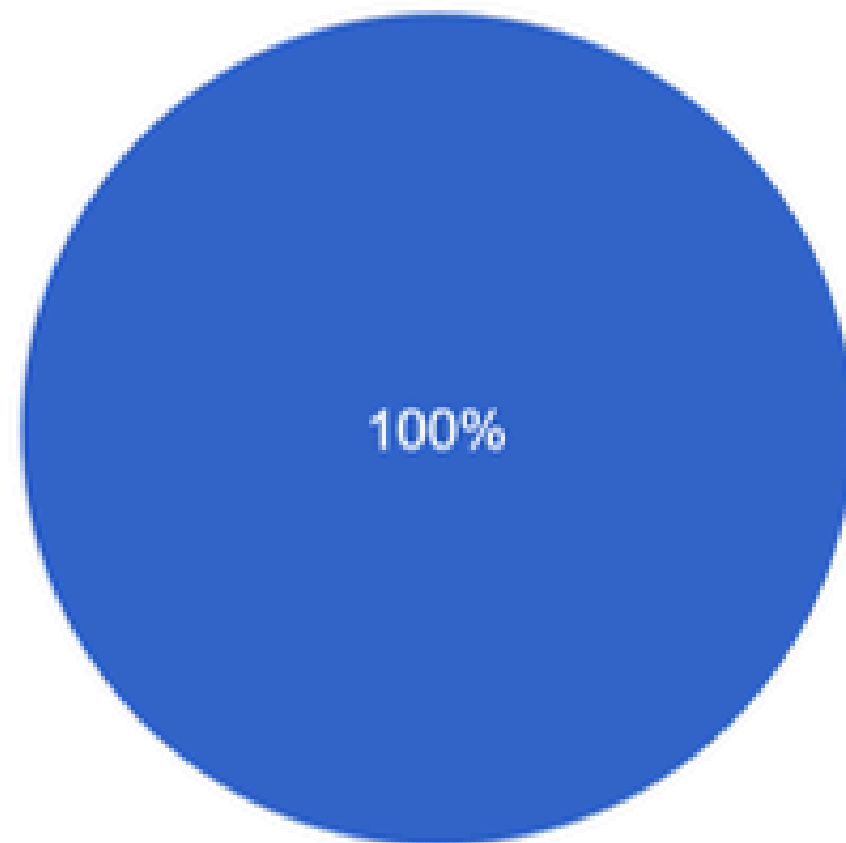
Did you receive your holy cards for St. Monica?

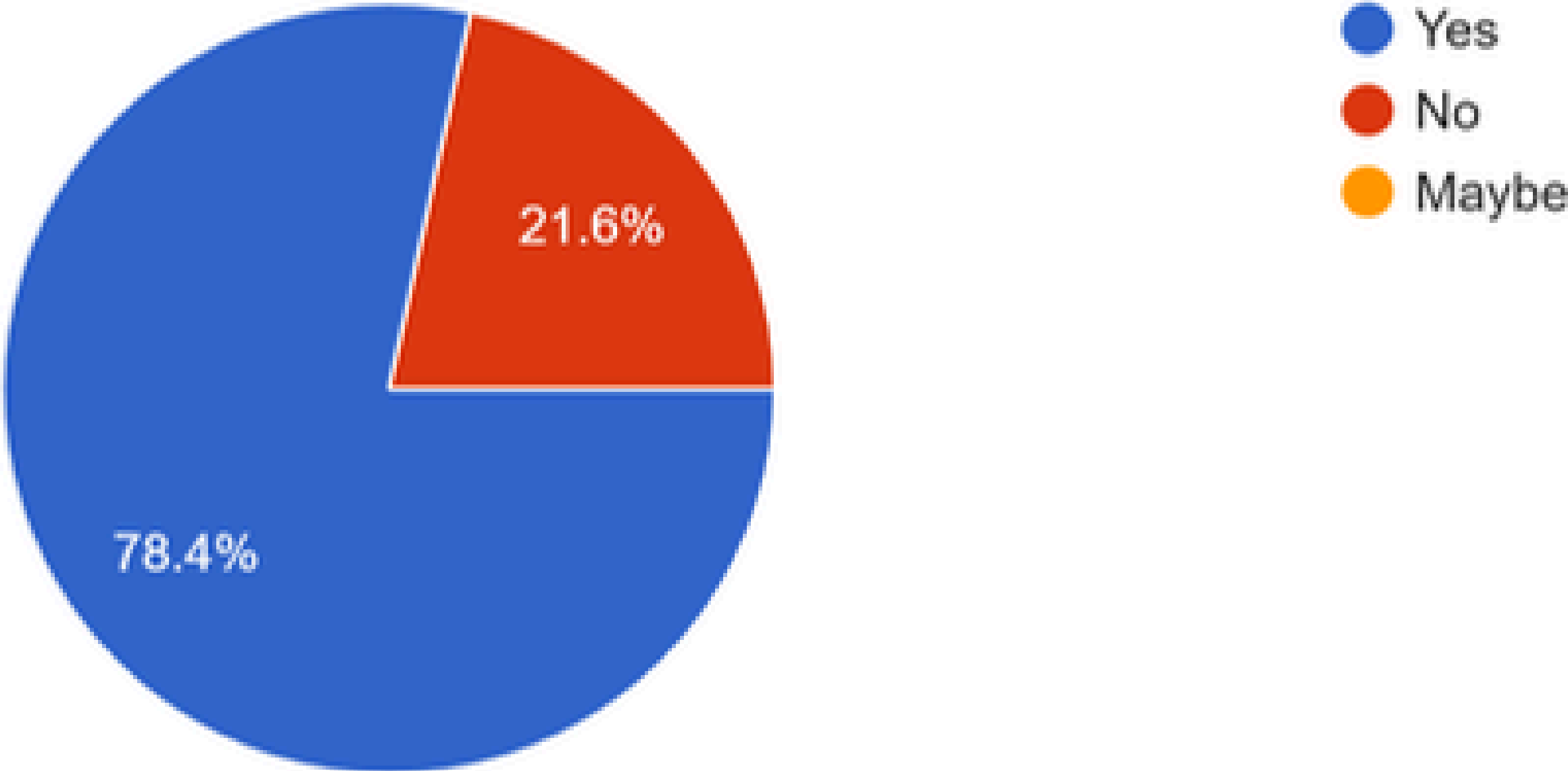

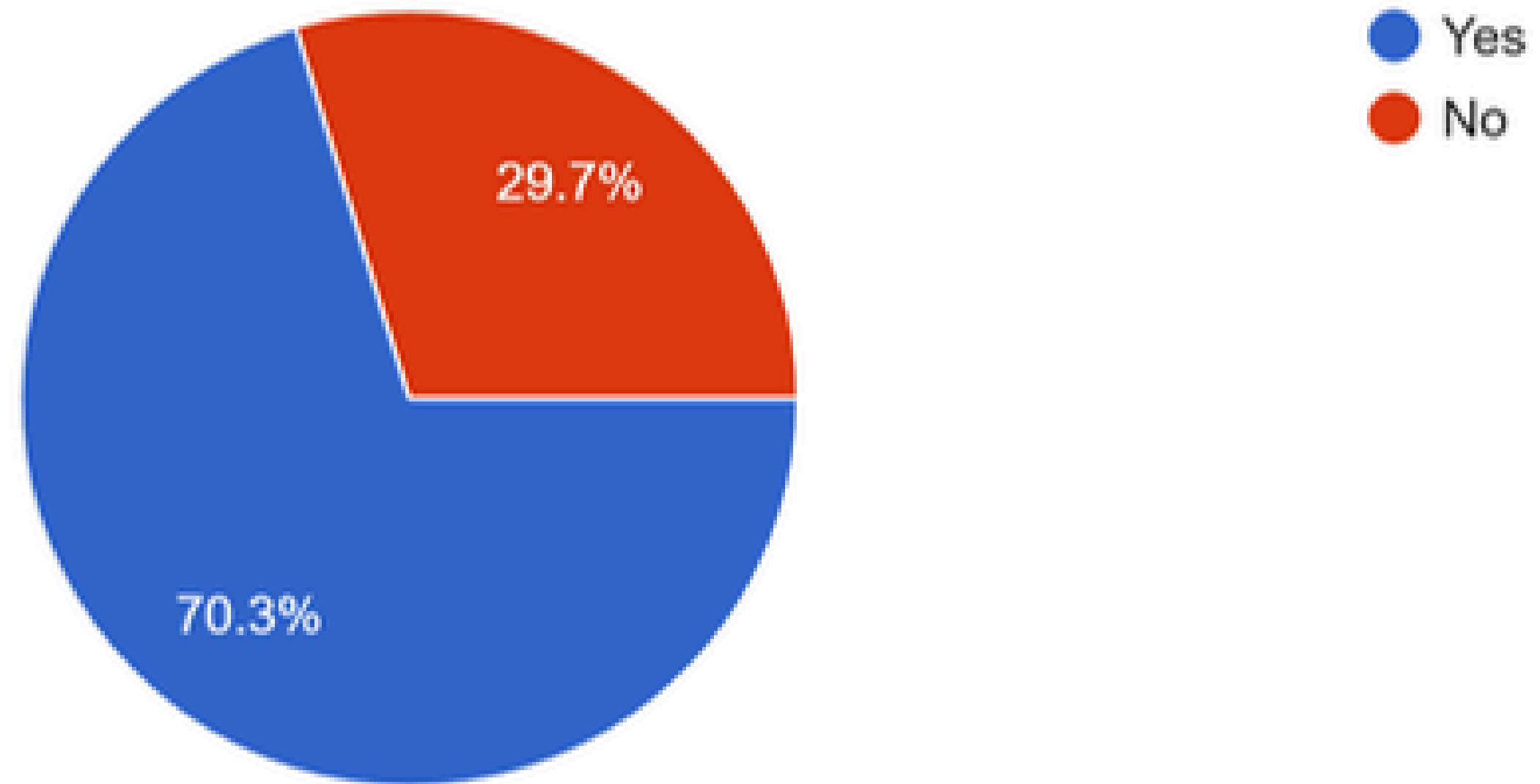
Donation to Birthright and Pregnancy Centers

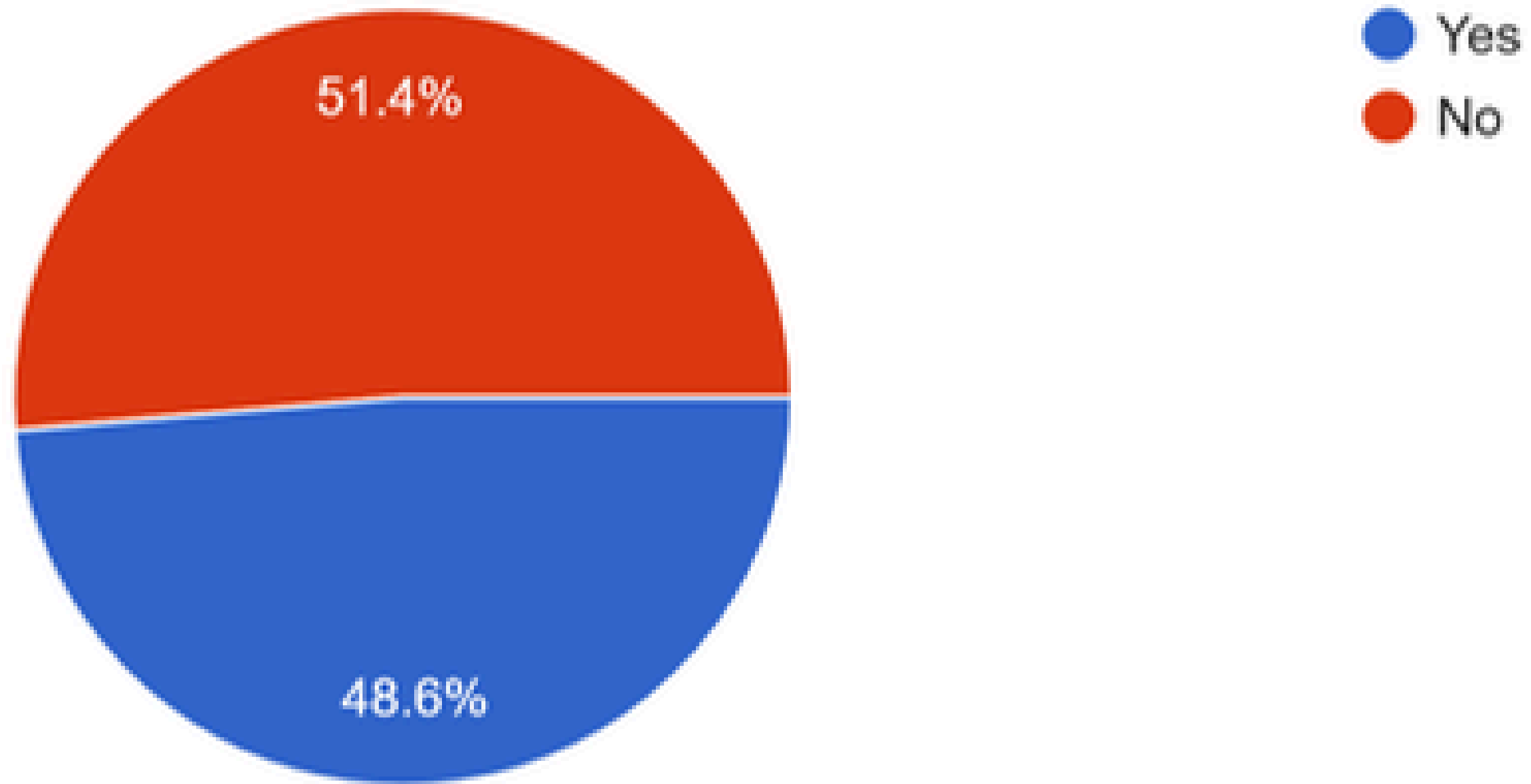

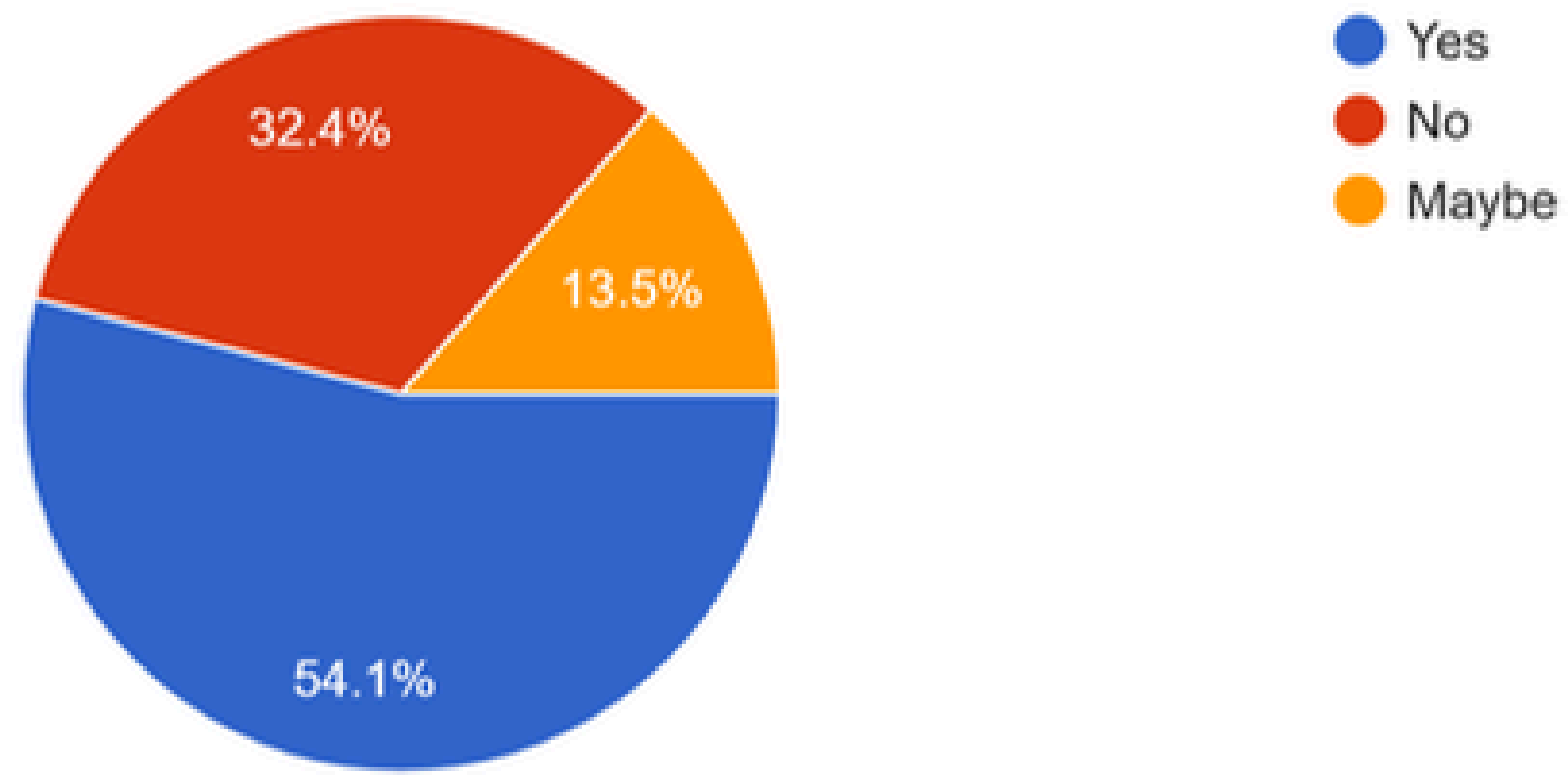

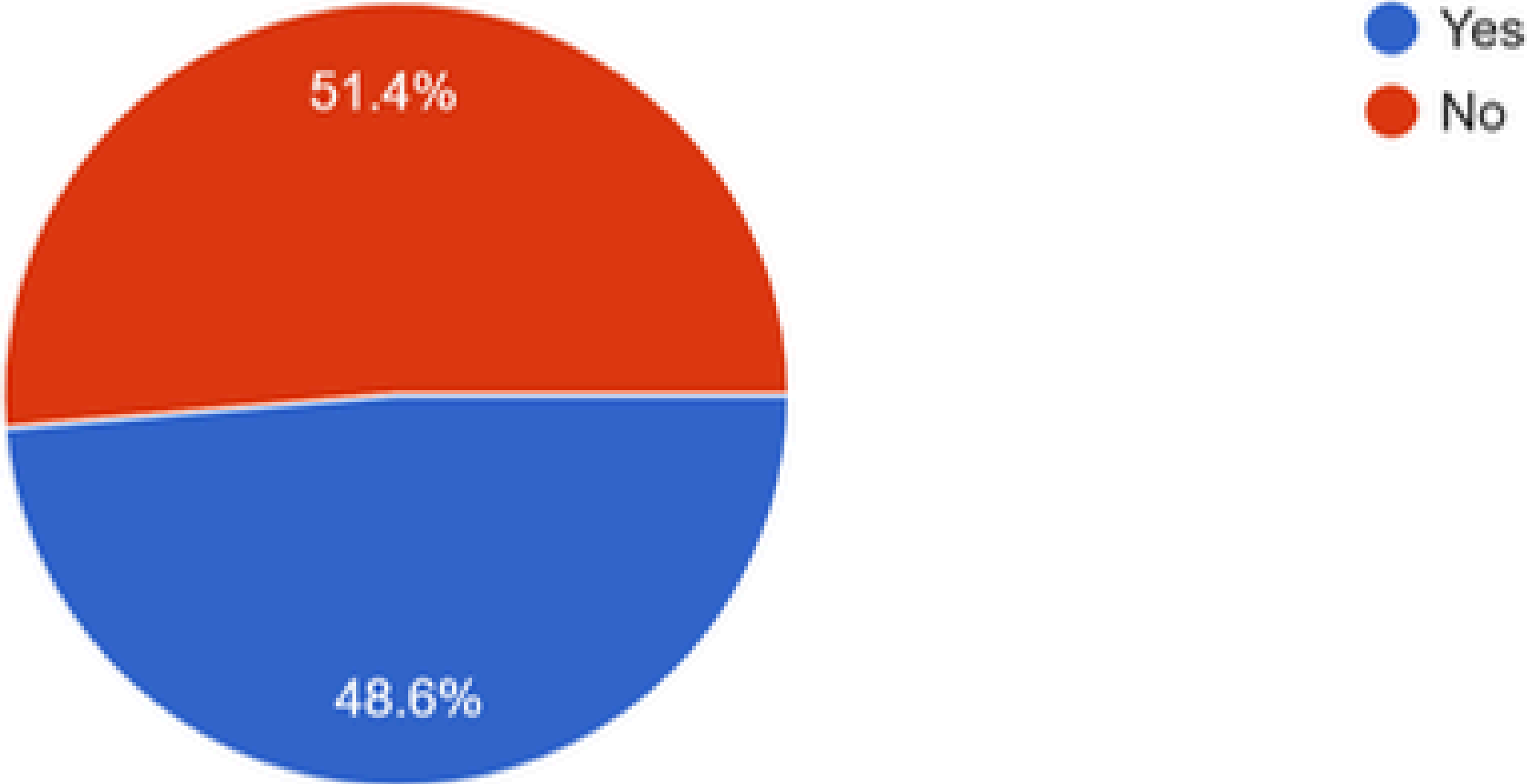
Have you used information from the Nebraska Catholic Conference?

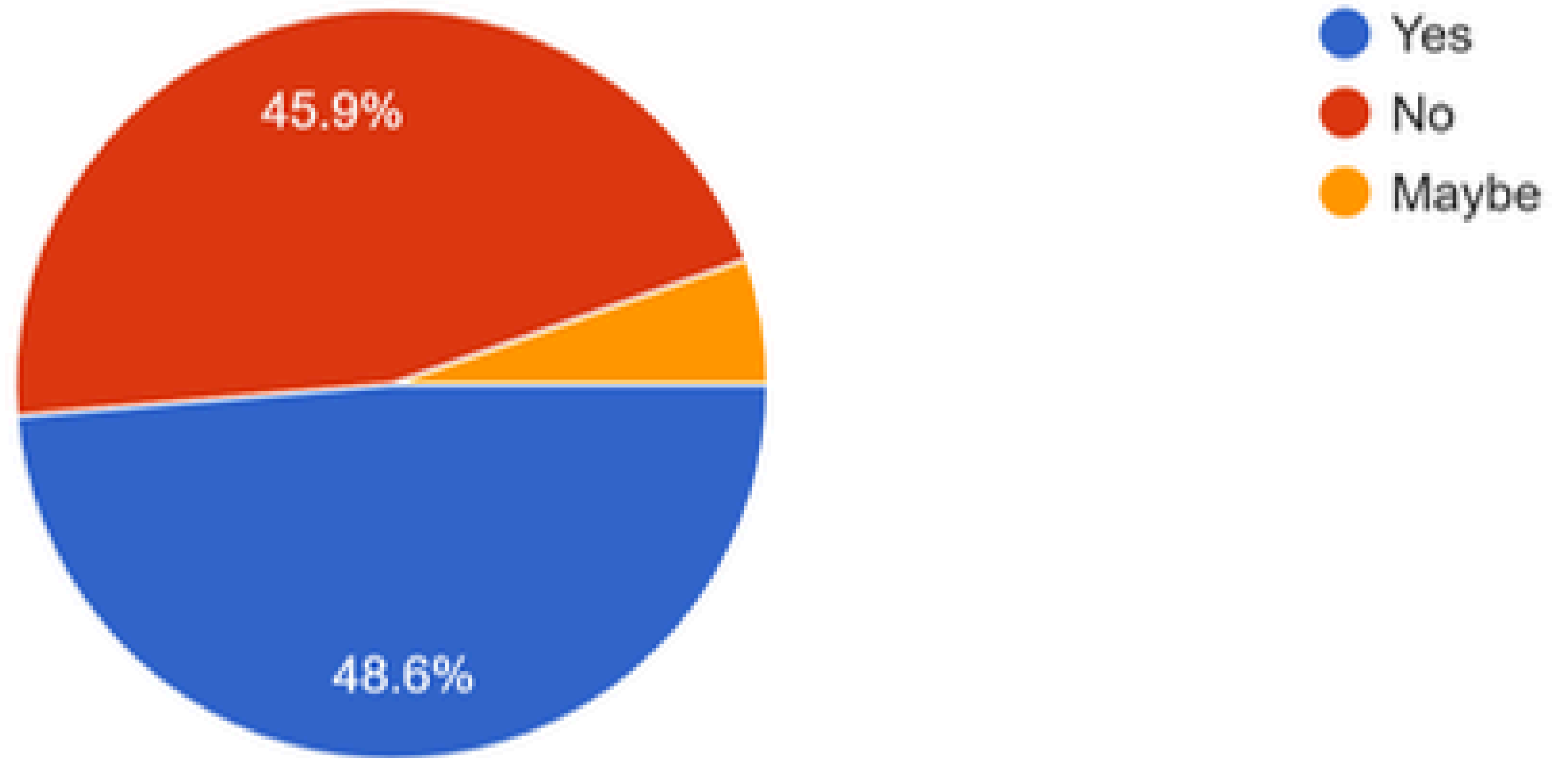
Do you provide legislative information to your council?

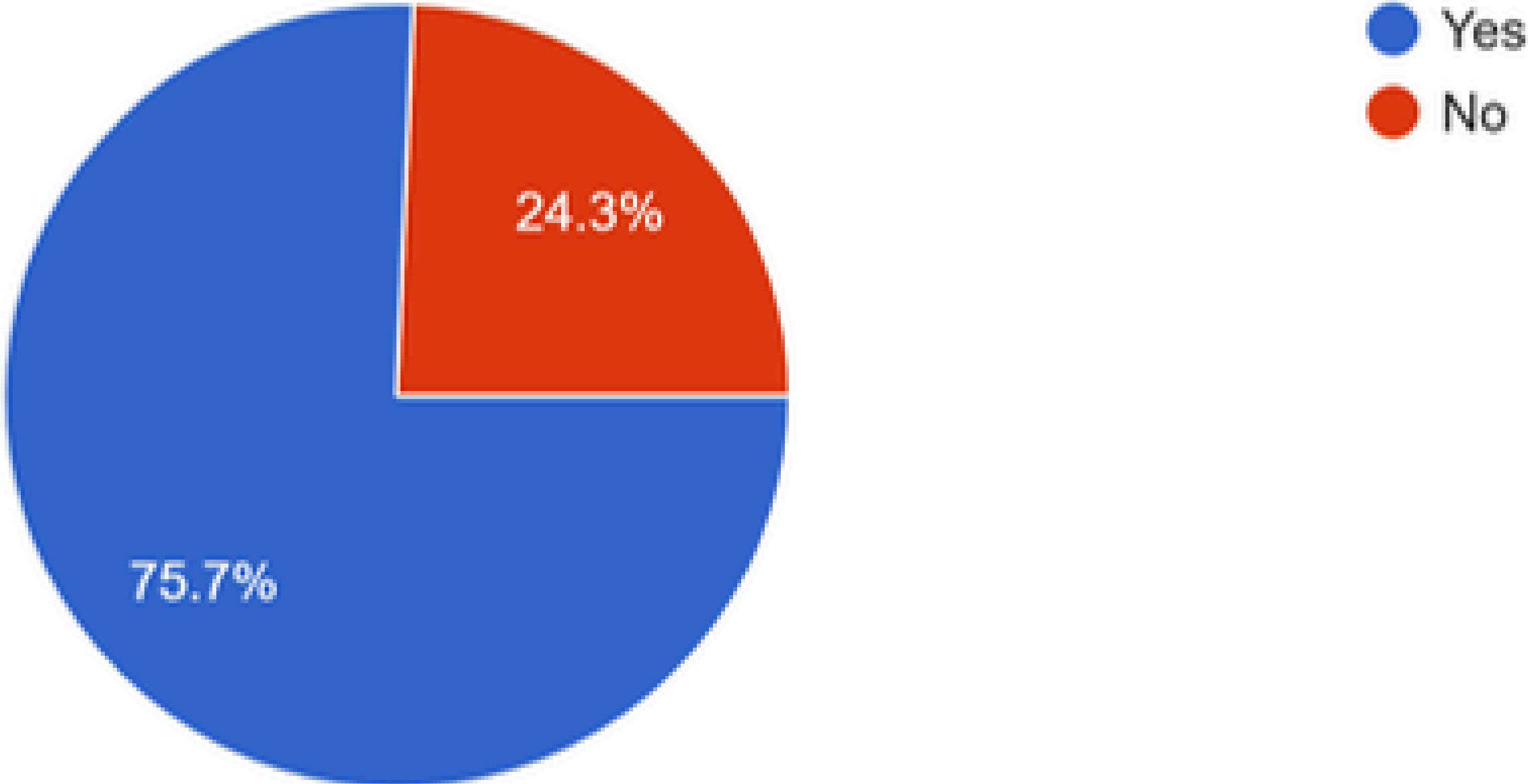


How did you celebrate LDCCW Sunday?

- 1 hr. business meeting followed by fellowship and social time at our meetings (with refreshments). We promote through Facebook, Flocknote and bulletin flyers, pulpit announcements, personal invitations via text and face to face. We also have offered door prizes, or "bring a friend" prizes.

- “Did you know” messages were placed in Bulletin to share more information about our PCCW, personal calls/emails to younger women of the parish to personally ask them to get involved and explain our purpose/mission
- elected younger officers to vacamt positions' send out texts before meetings
- We reeducate our parish women on the mission of the PCCW in January of every year. We advertise our projects in the bulletin and via Flocknote. We moved meeting times to be more accomodating of family schedules. Most or all communication is done via Flocknote and has reached many more women.

- Society members shopping for the food and then delivering it, this year 10 helped with the tasks.

- 2 Fish Fries during lent as a Fund Raiser, Fall Feast Dinner as another Fund Raiser in October

- Children's mass for Christmas
- During Christmas break, we serve a meal for the college basketball teams, since the cafeteria is not open at that time

- Provide brunch for the Confirmation retreat and a gift for each confirmandi. Gifts for incoming RCIA women and new parishioners.
- Rosary Walk with celebration. Eucharistic procession. Donations to Hope for the Poor and the Lincoln Shelter.
- Our parish supports and helps run the community food pantry which provides about 80 food boxes per month and Christmas food and gifts in December.
- block party - In the fall we have an outside get together of music, food & games. This year we had John Cook (Nebraska Volleyball coach) as a speaker
- Bunco, floral arrangements
- Harvest treats to farmers - granola bars given to local elevators, support many LDCCW projects

- We host a brunch in May to honor mother's, graduates, 1st Communicants, Confirmants. We host a brunch in December to celebrate the season.
- Babies Baptized: Three babies were baptized in 2025. Families were honored on December 28, 2025 with a gift and refreshments after Mass. Roses for Sisters: Instead of roses, Masses were offered for their intentions for our 3 hometown sisters and the 2 Christ the King Sisters that taught summer school. St. Monica Prayer: Prayed before Mass during April. Adopt-a-Priest: Masses were offered for their birthday and anniversary. Rosary: Pray the Rosary on Wednesdays at 9:15am.
- Walk for Life: Organized and passed out signs for this annual event. Camp Kateri: Paid ½ of the student registration cost for attending Camp Kateri Summer Camp or the Leadership Camp. Spirit Catholic Radio: Called into the fundraiser event and donated \$100. LDCCW Convention: Two women from the parish attended. LDCCW Diocesan Leadership Training: Hosted event in June.

- Quilts: 39 quilts were made. 1 quilt was raffled at the fall bazaar, 4 were sold at the fall bazaar, 2 were given away, and 32 were donated to CSS in Hastings. 4 baby blankets and 4 bibs were sold at the fall bazaar. 14 baby blankets and 8 bibs were donated to CSS. 20 baby blankets were donated to the York Pregnancy & Family Resource Center.
- Diaper Drive: Collected 2,085 diapers and 736 wipes. Advent Giving Tree: 70 ornaments for children and families from Filmore County Middle School were on the Advent Tree.
- Fall Bazaar/Bake Sale: The Fall Bazaar/Bake Sale was held during Advent. 5 quilts, donated items, and baked goods were sold. The proceeds were donated to CSS Home Kits, Homeless Outreach, Prison Ministry, and our local Blue Valley Pantry.
- World Marriage Day: Honored 14 couples married 50+ years with Masses offered for their intentions. Catechism Meals: Served meals to the CCD students (K-12) and teachers in January and November. Catechism Mass: Served refreshments after the CCD Mass each month during the school year.
- First Communion: First Communicants received a gift and special treat.
- Lenten Baby Shower: Held baby shower during Lent. 713 diapers, 1,012 wipes, plus several outfits, pajamas, onesies, and socks were collected. Items were donated to the York Pregnancy & Family Resource Center.

- Soup Supper: The soup supper is our main fundraiser and was held in February. Senior Mass: Graduates received a gift and were honored with refreshments after Mass. Thanksgiving Community Meal: Provided the ham and workers. CCD Advent Program: Served soup luncheon following program.
- Summer Feast Day picnic with local Knights Council and inviting Mission Parishes; Community Fall Dinner open to public
- Community rummage sale - donated left over items to Disabled American Veterans, Fathers Day breakfast, September breakfast, Valentines for shut-ins, Christmas goody bags for shut-ins, Penance Service - set up, supplied food, and served dinner to six priests. Confirmation - set up, supplied food, and served dinner to six priests including Bishop, Priest Appreciation- monetary gifts to both of our priests, funeral dinners, fish fry - helped with food prep and serving/clean up, November Memorial to honor deceased parishioners, \$500 donation to our Spring Dinner Benefit, placed black bunting on the front doors of the church as a sign of mourning and honor when Pope Francis died, supplied goodies for “Santa is Coming to a Home” basket.

- Purchased new window treatments for parish hall. Gifts for Confirmandi and First Communicants.
- St. Valentines flowers/cards for homebound and members who have lost a family member; Valentines crafting social for all residents in the 3 nursing homes in Aurora; Lenten care package for Father Seiker; Church spring cleaning; \$1500 donation to Steubenville Youth Trip; Totus Tuus meals and volunteer classroom help; Parish Hall refrigerator donation of \$1000; Pilgrimage to 3 churches within our diocese; supported 15 students in the Aurora school supplies program; Purchased new votive candles for the church; Made \$200 pledge to Spirit Catholic Radio; Purchased Altar breads and wines; Donated \$500 to Hamilton County Food Pantry; Supported 20 students in the Christmas Giving Tree; Sponsored "Gathered in Gratitude" social night to raise \$4600 for Pro-life Center; Fall Festival to promote family participation in the parish and raise funds for charitable projects in the parish; meals for families with newborn babies
- 2 Fish Fries during lent as a Fund Raiser, Fall Feast Dinner as another Fund Raiser in October
